CALL TO ACTION!!!

The health of Wopashitwe Ewen Mondo we Langa, aka David Rice, herein referred to as Mondo, is failing.

We are filing a request with the Nebraska Board of Pardons seeking his immediate release. While he and his supporters have maintained (and we believe we have proven) his innocence, he remains incarcerated in the Nebraska State Penitentiary. We continue to pursue all legal avenues to make the "system" recognize his innocence.

Due to his illness, we must make a plea to the Pardons Board to consider him for "compassionate release". Mondo has been diagnosed as having End Stage Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD). He has been asked to consider being placed in Hospice Care, in the prison. He refused.

Mondo intends to do all that is required to get better. Getting him out of there will give him a better chance of improving his condition. He will have access to better care and will be surrounded by those who love him.

This is a most urgent matter. We everyone reading this to take the time to write to the people who comprise the Board of Pardons. They have the final say as to Mondo's release, and we must show them that he has tremendous support and that the eyes of the world are upon them.

We need you to share this information / situation with your contacts. Ask them to join in the effort. Spread the word via twitter, face book, and any and all social media you use.

A sample letter and other documents about this case are posted on this site; please heed this call to action. We don't have much time.

Mondo has spent most of his life fighting for and serving our community. During his 45 years of wrongful incarceration he has continued to contribute to the betterment of others. The least we can do is give a few minutes of our time to help him when he needs us most.
