I write in reference to Wopashitwe Mondo Eyen we Langa. Mondo, #27768, (formerly David Rice) has spent the last 45 years in the Nebraska State Penitentiary. He is 68 years old and ill with End Stage Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD). Mondo has had a number of urgent medical interventions as a result. With the exception of visits to an outside hospital, he has been in the prison infirmary since October 7, 2015. Based on the gravity of his illness, I am requesting compassionate release for Mondo.

Please consider his immediate release.

The Governor, Secretary of State, and the Attorney General of Nebraska make up the Board of Pardons; the decision is theirs. It is most effective to write to each of them separately at their respective offices. Using the US Postal Service (snail mail) is preferred.

Your letter should be as direct as possible. It indicates your support for release for Wopashitwe Mondo Eyen we Langa, formerly David Rice, #27768. You may include information about yourself and why you are writing but please stay on message.

You are not being asked to write a legal or quasi-legal document. You are simply expressing yourself as a concerned citizen. Mondo deserves to be released because he is innocent and because he is gravely ill. Please include your name and address in each letter.

We cannot over stress the importance of your immediate action in this effort.
